Béxar Heritage 250 Event



On Tuesday, June 10, the Granaderos y Damas de Gálvez participated in a special event at the Béxar Heritage Center inside the Béxar County Courthouse.

This Béxar Heritage 250 event was a buildup to next year's celebrations for the 250th anniversary commemorating the signing of the Declaration of Independence.

Mari Tamez, Heritage Outreach Manager, coordinated the series of events. Fifty-four educators

from the San Antonio area arrived at the heritage center where they were welcomed by Rachel Sakai, the First Lady of Béxar County. They toured the amazing heritage center before leaving for a tour of a nearby mission, followed by a teacher workshop. Mrs. Tamez stated that it was an "empowering day of discovery, collaboration, and motivation at our Teacher Development Workshop on Béxar County's pivotal role in the American Revolution."

Some of our chapter's members gave educational presentations at the workshop, including Governor Joe González and Nathan Jones.
