On August 12th, we staffed a table at the Battle of Medina Symposium in Leming, TX. We are fortunate to have the opportunity at this event every year to sell books about Spain's participation in the American Revolution and to speak to people about our organization.

The symposium honors those who fought in the bloodiest battle on Texas soil. There were excellent presentations by various speakers and Granadero Jesse


Villarreal Sr. gave a heartfelt tribute to historian Robert Thonhoff, who helped bring attention to the Battle of Medina through his writings over the years.

We usually have very good sales of books at this symposium. This year, we brought in a total of \$370 with the sale of books and a challenge coin.

We sold 4 Sarávia books about Gálvez, 3 Sons of St. Francis books by Governor Joe González, and one each by Past Governor General Joel Escamilla (Pacheco VS. Menchaca) and Dama Edna Gravenhorst (San Antonio's Market Square).

The following books, all by Granadero Rueben Pérez, brought in \$110 of the total: 3 Laredito, Forgotten Neighborhood, 1 Caminos, Calles & Streets of S.A., 1 A Collection of Stories, Bernardo de Gálvez. The income from Rueben's books goes directly to the scholarship fund. Thank you, Joe González, Janie & Manny Rodriguez, and Joe Pérez for staffing the table.




BOOK DONATION BY RUEBEN PÉREZ



The meeting was called to order at 7:10 p.m. by Governor Joe González. The Invocation was given by Chaplain Joe Weathersby. Jesse Guerra led us in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Treasurer Manny Rodriguez gave the Treasurer's report. Savings account balance as of June 1, 2023 was \$4,090.04. Bank dividend of \$0.88. Ending balance for June was \$4,090.92.. Checking account balance as of June 1, 2023 was \$7,698.92. Activity for the month was as follows. We received 1 membership totaling \$30.00, Income from shirt sales at 50.00 and a bank dividend of \$0.31. Outgoing payments were, Payment for purchase of books \$276.04 June end of month balance is \$7,503.19. Savings account balance as of July 1, 2023 was \$4,090.92. Purchase of 1 CD for \$2,000.00 and received bank dividend of \$0.68. Ending balance for July is \$2,091.60. Checking account balance as of July 1, 2023 was 7,503.19. Activity for the month was as follows, we received 2 associate membership for \$30.00, and the bank dividend was \$0.28. Outgoing payments were as follows, Payment to Cortez Liquid for \$140.00, payment for D&F rehearsal room for \$35.00, payment for shipment of blasóns \$9.65, and purchase of event supplies \$91.99. July end of month balance is \$6,256.83, Motion to accept the Treasurer's report was made by Freddy Bustillo and seconded by Ruben Perez. Motion carried.

Governor González acknowledged our guest for the evening. Governor González announced all birthdays for the month of August.

Old business: The purchase of 2 CDs, one for scholarship fund and one for general fund. National meeting information will be forthcoming with information of registration.

New Business: Honorary membership was bestowed upon Steve Chiscano by Governor Joe González and past Governor Joe Perez. Announcements: By law amendments voting will be done at the September meeting. Battle of Medina Symposium in Atascosa County will be August 12, 2023 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.. Granaderos National Meeting will be November 3rd though the 4th in Baton Rouge. Governor González introduced our guest speaker for the evening. Anthony Delgado is a ninth generation Canary Island descendant and eleventh generation Tejano who is extremely proud of his familial connections to some of the most notable Hispanic figures spanning three centuries of Texas history, beginning with the first Spanish colonial families who founded what we now know as San Antonio.

After a short question and answer session, the meeting was adjourned at 8:21 by Governor González.
